Whatever we make of the mystery of the Trinity, the readings today stress that God, no matter how we talk of God, is love. The god of tenderness in the first reading, and in the gospel God so loved the world as to send his son.

St Ignatius Loyola speaks of the Trinity, looking down on the world, and saying 'our lovely world needs to be saved'. They saw people in darkness and wanted to send the light of the world; in grief and wanted to send the joy of their life into the world. Trinity Sunday is the feast of God's desire to be with us in the dark times of life to bring the light of the risen Lord.

The Trinity is not all up in the sky! - they look into the world... the heartache, the violence, the depressions, the weaknesses and know we need help, so Jesus came among us, as one of us, God has skin and humanity.

Our people need to be saved through love, and a just society. Our planet needs to be saved from the damage and hurt caused to it. May we, in the words of the second reading 'live in peace' - with each other and with our planet.
