## Plastic Free July.

Plastic Free July is a growing global movement where people are committing to increasing their awareness of the amount of plastic in their world and to taking action to reduce it. It is a month to make a very conscious effort to say **NO** to single use plastic every time you can.

To kick start the month, Sick of Plastic are launching a Postcard directed at the 5 big Supermarkets in Ireland asking them to **PLEASE** make it easier for us to reduce our plastic waste.

Postcards will be available at the back of the church or in the parish office, where they can be signed and collected in bulk. No need to post your card just sign it and pop it in the box provided.

## GETTING TO KNOW MATTHEW.

2. Read the weekly SUNDAY GOSPEL A4 sheet which will give prayer pointers to help in deepening our awareness of the Sunday Gospel. This sheet is available on the table in the middle of the church from Thursday of each week or on the parish web site under Fr. Michael Blog. Free of charge.
3. Collect a copy of the Sunday bulletin each week from the church and read the readings to prepare oneself for a better participation in the Sunday liturgy. Bulletins are ready by Thursday.
4. Purchase of Bible Study book from the Parish Office. Very basic but interesting. Price €10.



**Alleluia, alleluia! The seed is the word of God, Christ the sower; whoever finds this seed will remain forever. Alleluia!**


**GOSPEL Matthew 13: 1-9 (Shorter form only)**

**A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.** Jesus left the house and sat by the lakeside, but such crowds gathered round him that he got into a boat and sat there. The people all stood on the beach, and he told them many things in parables. He said, 'Imagine a sower going out to sow. As he sowed, some seeds fell on the edge of the path, and the birds came and ate them up. Others fell on patches of rock where they found little soil and sprang up straight away, because there was no depth of earth; but as soon as the sun came up they were scorched and, not having any roots, they withered away. Others fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Others fell on rich soil and produced their crop, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. Listen, anyone who has ears!'



What is the best soil for the word of God today? Jesus's story is both about the sowing and the ground that receives the seed. Much of the world today cannot hear the word of God through greed, violence, even the prideful belief that we do not need God.
