Parish Lenten Program – AT SEA WITH GOD.

Dealing with Storms in our lives.

How to ride the storms and grow as individuals as result of the experiences of our lives.

Go higher, go deeper: it is said that there is calmer water a mere ten feet below the trough of the highest waves. Pilots also report that flying conditions at higher altitudes can be very much more stable than the turbulences around at lower altitudes. A very valuable way of dealing with our life's turbulence can be to make space regularly to be still, at a deeper level (or a higher) level of awareness, in reflective prayer. New perspectives often emerge out of this kind of stillness, and the clamour of the immediate turmoil can give way to the deeper, more eternal rhythms and harmonies that alone can redirect our courses.

EASTER OFFERINGS. Easter is a time when we, individually, acknowledge our appreciation for what God has done for us in Jesus. We do this by participating actively in the Easter ceremonies but also by our individual or family Easter offering. In this regard Easter envelopes are available in the church.
