CHURCH SANITISING.

The Committee set up to oversee the ongoing sanitising of the church and to ensure that we adhere to official regulations have made the following decisions.

1. While the Fogger being used to sanitise the church is helpful, the mist created hangs in the building for a considerable time. Hence, it has been decided **not to change the Sunday Mass time** and instead to continue with the manual sanitizing after the 10.30 Mass.
2. The Committee are conscious that the use of the Fogger involves less people, however they feel that the sanitising of the church should be the concern of all. The period when we were manually sanitising after Mass was a positive community effort and would be pity to discard it. **So the practice of sanitising the church will be once again be done manually after morning Mass.**
3. The Fogger will be used after the final Mass every day and the church locked for the rest of the day.
4. The Committee prefers to have the church open all day. Fogging after adoration required the church to be closed for an extended period and is very inconvenient to the few who were fogging to have to come and go to re-open the church each day.
5. Our church is located at the intersection between a shopping centre and hospital and is a popular place for quiet prayer during the day. It's good that we make every effort that our doors are open as long as possible.
6. The second collection on Sundays helps pay for materials required to sanitise the church. To date we have spent about €900 on Materials from the €1,316 collected



GOSPEL Matthew 14: 22 - 33


A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew
