There is a story told about a church in France which had a beautiful statue of Christ the King above the high altar with arms outstretched to the world. Unfortunately, during the Second World War the church was bombed and left in a mass of rubble.

After the war, when the parish priest and his workers were sifting through the mass of rubble, they were happy to discover the statue of Christ the King but when they moved the rubble, they were saddened to discover that both hands had been blown off during the air-raid that demolished the church. At the foot of the statue, they were surprised to discover the writing – now, I have no hands but yours.

### GOSPEL Mark 5:21 - 24. 35 - 43 (Shorter Version)

*A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark*  
When Jesus had crossed in the boat to the  
other side, a large crowd gathered round him  
and he stayed by the lakeside. Then one of the  
synagogue officials came up, Jairus by name,  
and seeing him, fell at his feet and pleaded  
with him earnestly, saying, 'My little daughter is  
desperately sick. Do come and lay your hands on  
her to make her better and save her life.' Jesus  
went with him and a large crowd followed him;  
they were pressing all round him.

Some people arrived from the house of the  
synagogue official to say, 'Your daughter is dead:  
why put the Master to any further trouble?' But  
Jesus had overheard this remark of theirs and he

faith.' And he allowed no one to go with him  
except Peter and James and John the brother

they laughed at him. So he turned them all out  
and, taking with him the child's father and mother  
and his own companions, he went into the place  
where the child lay. And taking the child by the  
hand he said to her, 'Talitha, kumi!' which means,  
'Little girl, I tell you to get up.' The little girl got up  
at once and began to walk about, for she was  
twelve years old.

At this they were overcome with astonishment,  
and he ordered them strictly not to let anyone  
know about it, and told them to give her something  
to eat.
