SYNOD SURVEY.

The diocese has completed its submission from the people of the Diocese of Cork and Ross to the Pre Synodal Process. This diocesan synthesis is now submitted to form part of a national synthesis. Over the coming weeks portions of the report will be contained in the newsletter.

"The question of the relevance of 'church' as an institution to people and their current daily lives was reflected loudly in our discernment as a steering group. People across all age groups commented on the relevance of language used in and by the church and the relevance of the formal organised church for the current young generation. The steering group in discernment following the listening journey, questioned the relevance of the questions posed to the people who responded to them, both online and at in-person gatherings – it appeared that people did not always relate the question to themselves and their own personal experience, but to some other people 'out there'.

"People identified their engagement in Ministries of the Word, Eucharist, finance, church cleaning and sacristan duties as a factor in them feeling a part of their community. Being part of the local parish life provides an experience of solidarity, forms an important part of their engagement and connection with the community, particularly post COVID".

Donations can be placed in the box at the front of the altar beside the candle with the Ukrainian flag.




Wilton Walking Group. New start time—11.15 am

FACES OF CORK – Part 2.



And Abraham gave him a tithe of everything.



A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to him and said, 'Send the people away, and they

can go to the villages and farms round about to find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely place here.' He replied, 'Give them something to eat yourselves.' But they said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people.'

For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, 'Get them to sit down in parties of about fifty.' They did so and made them all sit down. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd.
