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During 2022 we raised funds for various charities which amounted to about €50,000. Fantastic, well done for such a generous response.

The bulk of this money was sent to assist the SMA in Poland to accommodate Ukrainian refugees. We also assisted Paddy Barry SMA in the construction of a new house in Zambia, and the SMA in Tanzania who support an Albino community. Other charities were Trocaire, the local Air Ambulance helicopter; Mercy Hospital Cancer research; a group in Midleton Hub setting up of drop-in centre and suicide awareness program; we assisted the youth from Scala (Redemptorists) raise funds for youth programs in Asia etc; we assisted a Zimbabwean nun who runs a Justice office in Israel for refugees and migrant workers and the L'arch Centre in Bethlehem.
