Introduce Biodiversity - Friendly Mowing

Regularly mown grass looks neat but is a green desert for biodiversity. Cutting less often allows wildflowers to grow and provide important food for our insects, especially pollinators. Identify some areas where you don't begin mowing until after the 15th April and then cut on a 6 weekly rotation. Not cutting until mid-April allows Dandelions to flower but not set seed. Cutting at the end of May and not again until mid-late July will increase the growth of important wildflowers like Clover, Selfheal, Cuckooflower and Bird's-foot-trefoil.


