There is a saying that "whatever we do in Church is practice for what we do outside". The time we spend in church in personal devotion and prayer must be translated into time we spend in the streets and the world. God cares more about how we treat the "Other Body of Christ, the Other Eucharist, than any devotion we may have to what is in Church.

How does this image of God among us affect you and your prayer life and practice, alone and with others in the Body of Christ?

The Annual Corpus Christi Procession.

For the first time since 2019 the Cork Corpus Christi Procession (the 97th procession) will take place on Sunday the 11th June.

The procession begins from the Cathedral of Saint Mary and Saint Anne, at 3.00pm; it crosses the Christy Ring Bridge and journeys to Saint Peter and Paul's Church, for a homily preached by Bishop Fintan Gavin, and concluding with benediction.

All are invited to walk in the procession or come to St. Peter and Paul's church.

Our parish charity for the month of June is *Down Syndrome Cork*. This is a charity, based in our locality and doing great work. In addition to donations we will give the charity any proceeds we generate from the sale of books in the church and also in the Coffee dock. To date we have collected 1,283.

An excellent start. It's great to see that we can be so generous to a local and deserving charity.


(The charity is known locally as "Field of Dreams", Clash Road, Curaheen.

GOSPEL John 6:51-58

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John Jesus said to the Jews:

'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world'.

Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said. Jesus replied:

'I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood. you will not have life in you. Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day.

For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him.

As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father. so whoever eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from heaven: not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead.
