THE MESSAGE OF TODAY'S GOSPEL. (Mt 22:1-14)

We can tell the story of the parable in three stages. The first stage describes the great insult. The king sends out his invitation to the wedding of his beloved son, but the guests decline to come. The king is patient, he sends out yet another group and they refuse to come. Once again the guests have other things to do.

The destruction of the city possibly recalls the destruction of Jerusalem by the Romans for Matthew. The last point is put more visibly in the second parable of the gospel, *the story of the wedding garment*. There is a great temptation in the modern world to take the things of God for granted and to trivialize the role of religion in human life. Many people like to drift through life almost as though salvation were guaranteed at the end. The fate of the man without the wedding garment should be a reminder that for the Gospel we cannot go on just drifting along, feeling safe in our preconceived ideas and habits. We might call this to mind every time we come to Mass. We do not come to Mass just to pay a compliment to God by our presence! We need to be there for the strength for the graces the Mass offers us.
